RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE OF HERMON has adopted and is enforcing a BUILDING CODE, under the Village Ordinance as last adopted, as amended, on January 16, 1973, and

WHEREAS, Article 15 of the aforesaid prohibits any person, firm or corporation from erecting, constructing, enlarging, altering, repairing, improving, moving or demolishing any building or structure without first obtaining a separate building permit for each building or structure from the BOARD OF TRUSTEES, and

WHEREAS, the BOARD OF TRUSTEES must examine all plans and specifications for the proposed construction when application is made to them for a building permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the VILLAGE BOARD of the VILLAGE OF HERMON as follows:

Section 1. That the BOARD OF TRUSTEES shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location that has a flood hazard, any proposed new construction or substantial improvement (including prefabricated and mobile homes) must (i) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (ii) use construction materials and utility equipment that are resistant to flood damage, and (iii) use construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage; and

Section 2. That the BOARD OF TRUSTEES shall review subdivision proposals and other proposed new developments to assure that (i) all such proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, (ii) all public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located, elevated, and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, and (iii) adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards; and

Section 3. That the BOARD OF TRUSTEES shall require new or replacement water supply systems and/or sanitary sewage systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and require on-site waste disposal systems to be located so as to avoid impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding.
